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

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


Deschutes River Trail

Adjacent to Tumalo State Park in northwest Bend along the east side of the Deschutes River, Riley Ranch Nature Reserve is a 184-acre former ranch that is opening to the public in 2018. The property offers connectivity with the Deschutes River Trail from the state park south to Archie Briggs Canyon on Awbrey Butte. Trampoline Park



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STARGAZING

Worthy Additions

Bend's first east side brewery and pub continues to grow, bringing its Beertopia mission to fruition. The brewery produced 15,000 barrels last year and expanded its dining to include the Beermuda Triangle, which bridges the dining room and lawn area with a new bar and more seating. A path of celestial mosaic tiles leads to the Hop Mahal, a rentable event space. Tours in the family-friendly Hopservatory include live NASA feeds and stargazing through a powerful telescope. Finish the Worthy experience with a beer at the Star Bar (21-and-over). Worthy's downtown Bend outpost, Taps and Tacos, opens spring 2018. worthybrewing.com

SNOW

Fat Bike Trails

Last winter, the Central Oregon Trail Alliance created a new trail system for fat bikes, wide-wheeled bikes that have become popular for biking on snow. Skiers and snowboarders can take advantage of wider and smoother runs from the top of Cloudchaser, the newest lift at Mt. Bachelor, as the easternmost terrain enters its second lift-accessed season. Crews widened runs and removed obstacles, improving runs and transitions between trails. Other upgrades to one of the Northwest's top resorts include new downhill and Nordic snow cats and a tiller to bolster the grooming fleet, as well as upgrades to the food and beverage experience. mtbachelor.com

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DISCOVERY

Cascade Lakes Welcome Station

A paved 3.4-mile, wheelchair accessible trail now connects the Haul Road Trail to the 2,080-square-foot, shiny new Cascade Lakes Welcome Station that serves as the gateway to the Deschutes National Forest.

Buy a forest pass at the welcome station and have the staff of forest experts walk you through the region on the welcome center's giant floor map. An interactive touch screen further aids trip-planning for adventurers looking for longer treks down the Cascade Lakes Scenic Byway. Park at the center and head out on a day hike or access the Phil's and Wanoga mountain biking trail systems. FS.USDA.GOV





Bend

Hailed as one of the best towns in the country by residents and visitors—oh yeah, and reputable sources such as *Outside Magazine*—Bend is an outdoor enthusiast hub with a bit of urban cool.

“Farewell Bend” was a village composed of a few makeshift buildings on the banks of the Deschutes River—the last hospitable spot pioneers saw on their epic wagon train journey west over the Cascade Range. Leaving the “Farewell” behind, Bend has remained hospitable as a hub of outdoor sport competitions and recreation.

Outside Magazine called Bend the “Best Multisport Town” in 2017. Races range from triathlons and multisport to skiing, running and mountain biking. For the less hardcore athletes, there’s a lazy float down the Deschutes River through Bend’s Old Mill District. Hikers will love the sixty-three miles of urban trails, including the Deschutes River Trail. Playtime is plentiful, with eighty-two parks and open spaces in town. Pooches will appreciate the off-leash areas in many local parks.

To complement Bend’s recreational options, a vibrant cultural arena is alive with art galleries, art walks, a full schedule of outdoor concerts and a theater scene. Makers gravitate to the High Desert, so locally made souvenirs are easy to come by. Making libations (and drinking them) is another popular pastime. Local wine, cider, distilled spirits and beer are all covered. If you are feeling formal, try one of the white-linen restaurants or keep it casual with great eats from a food cart.

ITINERARY

YOUR BASECAMP: The new Huntington Lodge at Pronghorn overlooks the Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Course. Fine restaurants, pools and residences with a plethora of amenities will fit any family’s needs. pronghornresort.com

SEE Tumalo Creek as it tumbles ninety feet at Tumalo Falls. Ten miles west of Bend, the falls are a year-round destination for hikers, bikers, snowshoers, cross-country skiers and photographers.

STROLL along the Deschutes River Trail, which runs the length of town on the east and west river banks and passes through the Old Mill District.

PLAY at Bend’s water park in the Old Mill District. Kayak or surf the standing wave, float the tuber passage-way or lounge on the beach.

SIP local beer at one of Bend’s twenty-nine, top-notch craft breweries on the Bend Ale Trail. There are also many beer festivals strewn throughout the year.

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Sisters

A small Western-themed town with a slow pace of life is overlaid with an ever-expanding creative culture and a long-standing outdoor recreation tradition.

In the shadow of the snowcapped Three Sisters mountains, Western-themed buildings are host to a blend of restaurants, more than fourteen galleries in the Hood Avenue Art District, a live music scene (Sisters Folk Festival) and crafters (Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show). The result is a picturesque snapshot

of small town life in the West, past and present. Nearby outdoor recreational opportunities are enhanced with the Peterson Ridge Trail System, which starts just blocks from the heart of downtown. Hike and backpack in the Three Sisters Wilderness, fish Whychus Creek and play golf at Aspen

Lakes and Black Butte Ranch. In addition, road cyclists can ride one of two Oregon Scenic Bikeways that start (or end) in this quaint little town. Dining options appeal to everyone—from foodies to steak-and-potatoes lovers—and include superb bakeries, casual fine dining and a brewery.



on the banks of the crystal-clear waters of the Metolius River, bound by old-growth ponderosa pines. Today, Camp Sherman is sought by fly-fishermen, hikers and mountain bikers for its miles of stream to fish and trail to ride and hike.





Newberry Country

South of Bend and Sunriver, geologic wonders abound. The area's largest town, La Pine, is a sparsely populated community cloaked in pines that goes by the apt slogan, "Small Town Strong."

The Newberry Crater in the Newberry National Volcanic Monument is a must-see natural wonder. The obsidian flows, vents, pumice cones, and hidden pockets of magma continue to fascinate geologists and adventurers. When this shield volcano's massive dome first collapsed around 500,000 years ago, what remained was the spectacular caldera we see today. From atop Paulina Peak (7,985 feet), you can witness thousands of acres of volcanic landscape with beautiful lakes (Paulina and East) and large lava fields, such as the Big Obsidian Flow. This ocean of lava was used by NASA astronauts in the 1960s to simulate the surface of the moon.

Olympic decathlon gold medalist Ashton Eaton is from the small town of La Pine, Central Oregon's southernmost town. La Pine is Central Oregon's last big secret, where pine trees and large land plots reign.

YOUR BASECAMP: Paulina Lake Lodge offers cabins on the shore of Paulina Lake. paulinalake.com

PLAY on fields of obsidian and climb to the rim of the Newberry Caldera to take in the twenty-five-mile diameter of the volcano. Feel the mist from Paulina Creek Falls on your skin. In winter, glide across the snow-covered terrain on cross-country skis or snowmobiles. Explore the caves, trails and natural wonders in Fort Rock State Park.

SOAK in the small, natural hot springs at East Lake and neighboring Paulina Lake or take out a boat with our

fishing rod and tackle box. The lakes are home to rainbow and brown trout, as well as kokanee salmon.

RIDE motorcycles on scenic roads—street and dual-cross rentals are available from Motofantasy at DiamondStone.

EXPERIENCE La Pine's heritage and July 4th festivities at La Pine Frontier Days and Rodeo. Or, make time in June for Oregon's only Rhubarb Festival. Also in July, the Newberry Event Music & Arts Festival brings more than twenty bands to three stages. Learn more about the region's history at the Fort Rock Homestead Museum.

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Lower Deschutes River

Steeped in American Indian heritage and rugged tradition, the vast open territory along the lower Deschutes River is prime cultural and outdoor adventure land.

MADRAS - CULVER

These towns are a major hub for the fishing, boating and hiking inclined. Anglers can wade into the flowing waters of the Deschutes, Metolius and Crooked rivers. Alternatively, spend a weekend on a houseboat at Lake Billy Chinook or RV Camp at The Cove Palisades State Park. Nearby, Lake Simtustus at Pelton Dam offers camping and swimming. Scenic

hiking on federally managed and conserved land is stellar in the Crooked River National Grassland, where The Peninsula and The Island are standout landmarks.


MAUPIN

Redsides and rafting are the mainstays of Maupin. Redsides are the brilliantly colored, hard-fighting native Deschutes River trout that anglers obsess over. Add to that the whitewater thrills, and this river

town is a hive for recreating. In recent years, Maupin has seen the addition of more lodging and dining amenities to make the town part of the draw.

WARM SPRINGS

The heart and soul of the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Warm Springs is the site of Indian Head Casino. For a cultural diversion, visit the namesake museum, one of the finest American Indian art museums in the West.

state as a premier ride.



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River Canyon Country

Winding waters cut through sunset-hued canyon walls that bind beauty with the promise of adventure in this rugged area that draws visitors from around the globe.

TERREBONNE

Terrebonne means “good earth” in French and this little town twenty-four miles north of Bend lives up to its name. This hamlet is home to one of the great natural wonders of Oregon, Smith Rock State Park. Watch climbers scale the towering spires while you spot golden eagles, prairie falcons and river otters along the hiking trails.

CROOKED RIVER RANCH

Located above the steep basalt canyon walls of the Deschutes River, Crooked River Ranch is best known for its golf, hiking and fishing. Witness the tumbling waters of Steelhead Falls or fly-fish the Foley Waters section of the Deschutes River.

PRINEVILLE

Blending history and the future, Prineville is home to both Oregon’s oldest public structure and tech industry data centers. Fish the Crooked River or the Prineville and Ochoco reservoirs. Camp, hike and mountain bike in the Ochoco National Forest and Maury Mountains.



Mill District. Take a class, a full-day river tour, or browse the extensive selection of kayaks, canoes, and all things paddle and rafting gear. The folks at Mountain Water Snow Sports are water sport experts who have non-summer sports covered, too. StandUp Paddle Bend also sells quality boards.

CAST A FLY

To drop a fly in Central Oregon's pristine waters is a thrilling motion. Whether you have a spinner or a fly rod, fishing options are robust and the fish are tall-tale worthy. The Deschutes is famous for its native redbreast rainbow trout and annual steelhead runs. The smaller Metolius River is known for

being home to monster bull trout. Crane Prairie Reservoir, Davis Lake and East Lake are all noted for their trophy trout. These are just a few of the bodies of water that deliver: Cultus Lake, Wickiup Reservoir, Crooked River—the list goes on. Wade or boat the waters on your own, or find one of the Bend, Sunriver or Sisters guiding services to take you to the best runs.

Local tactical advice, superb customer service, guided and unguided tours, casting lessons, fly-fishing classes and quality gear are in ready supply in Central Oregon. Check out Stillwater Fly Shop, Deschutes River Outfitters, The Fly Fisher's Place, Cascade Outfitters, River Borne Outfitters, and Fly & Field Outfitters.

TWIN BRIDGES LOOP

36 miles, round trip | Easy-Moderate

Begin in Bend's downtown Drake Park and follow a moderately hilly course past the city limits into farm and ranch country, rolling through rimrock canyons with views of snowcapped peaks. Cross the Deschutes River at Twin Bridges Road and stop in the tiny town of Tumalo. Dip your feet in the cool, clear water at Tumalo State Park. Eat lunch or sip a latte in town before powering home. With few extended climbs, this route provides a relatively mellow way to fill your lungs with mountain-fresh air and take in the sublime scenery.

SHERARS FALLS SCENIC BIKEWAY

33-mile loop | Moderate

Tour River Canyon Country starting in the heart of Maupin, then climb onto the high plateau between the Deschutes and White rivers. After 1,000 feet in elevation gain, you'll drop into Tygh Valley, cross the White River and Highway 197, pass White River Falls State Park and wind down toward the Deschutes riverbed, encountering the Bikeway's namesake, Sherars Falls.

MCKENZIE PASS

37 miles, one way | Challenging

Climb through deep forest up to a volcanic lava rock, moonscape-like summit. Stop at the Dee Wright Observatory, built from lava rock, and take in spectacular views of the Three Sisters mountains. A huge bonus: Most of this ride is on Route 242 (on the U.S. Register of Historic Places). Since 242 operates as a bikes-only route in spring before opening to vehicle traffic, this is the best time to ditch the shoulder lane and listen to the tranquil sounds of the wild without motorized disruption.

SISTERS TO SMITH ROCK

37 miles, one way | Moderate

This route weaves through Sisters country to Smith Rock State Park's impressive rock walls. The Crooked River winds at the base of the volcanic, multicolored formations towering above the valley floor. The varied, rolling terrain is generally downhill from Sisters. It is a perfect point-to-point ride if you leave a support vehicle in the public parking areas at each end.

MADRAS MOUNTAIN VIEWS

30 miles, loop | Moderate

Here, high desert and basalt palisades and sweeping views of the Cascades are all the better because of minimal traffic. Begin and end in small, friendly downtown Madras. Pedal to the stunning overlook above The Cove Palisades State Park and Lake Billy Chinook to glimpse eagles and other raptors soaring. Wind through the little towns of Culver and Metolius, stopping for refreshments. This area's mild winters mean year-round riding possibilities.



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Scenic Chairlift Rides
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MOUNTAIN BIKING



Extensive and renowned are words that describe the Central Oregon singlettrack network. On any given summer morning, families, retirees, visitors with rental bikes, old-school pioneers of the sport and nationally-ranked competitors alike will be congregating at trailheads.

Once out on the trails, though, you might not even see another rider as you wind through the forest. That's part of the beauty of Central Oregon mountain biking, with

more than 300 miles of trails beneath a canopy of ponderosa pines in the foothills of the Cascades: Everyone has room to roam. The lower-elevation trails cover all the bases: relatively flat, fast, and fun, with some tough technical sections and punchy climbs. Trails come in all levels, from beginner to shredder.

Higher up, ride in the shadows of snowcapped 10,000-foot peaks through high alpine meadows with breathtaking vistas. Rustic shelters used as warming huts in the winter are perfect for summer biking rest stops where you can take a breather, have a snack from your pack and enjoy the high elevation.

Phil's Trail is by far the most popular riding area in the region. The trailhead is just a couple of minutes from Bend. Don't let the hectic parking scene deter you. From the trailhead off Skyliners Road, riders can access a well-marked maze of diverse singlettrack with pockets of solitude to be found.

Ride technical mountain bike features suitable for all levels in Sisters at Bike Park 242, complete with a pump track and a larger riding circuit.

For more experienced mountain bikers, Mt. Bachelor's Downhill Bike Park is a great spot for a summer or fall ride. Grab your mountain bike, or a park rental, and hop on the chair lift. Cruise down intermediate and advanced trails.

MORE TRAILS

Peterson Ridge Trail System is a local favorite, accessible from downtown Sisters.

Smith Rock State Park offers some of the most scenic trails in Central Oregon.

The Maston area near Redmond is a winter riding option just off Cline Falls Highway.

GUIDED TRIPS

Let the folks at Cog Wild Mountain Bike Tours and Shuttles in Bend take you up the Cascade Lakes Highway to trails such as "Tiddlywinks" and "Funner." An epic ride popular in late summer among visitors (as well as locals) begins with a shuttle that takes you and your bikes to Dutchman Flat, near Mt. Bachelor. After a short, slow climb, you'll reap the reward, cruising downhill for about twenty miles back to Bend.

Cog Wild will also shuttle you from Bend to what has been called America's number one mountain bike trail, the McKenzie River Trail (a couple hours' drive northwest of Bend).

On this volcano right within the city limits, a nature trail and paved road offer routes to fantastic panoramas from the top.

TUMALO FALLS

Easy | 5.5-mile out and back | Skyliners Rd., Bend
View the falls less than a mile from the parking area. Continue on for more spectacular vistas. Road closed in winter.

PAULINA CREEK

Easy | 6 to 8.5 miles, out and back | Hwy. 97, Between La Pine and Sunriver
Follow the Peter Skene Ogden Trail along Paulina Creek past scores of waterfalls.

DEE WRIGHT MEMORIAL TRAIL

Easy | 1 mile, out and back | Hwy. 242, West of Sisters
View the Cascade Mountains from a paved trail with interpretive signs through one of the most recent lava flows in America. Closed in the winter.

SMITH ROCK STATE PARK

Easy to Difficult | Varying routes | Off Hwy 97, Terrebonne
At one of the 7 Wonders of Oregon, the trails wind through the Crooked River canyon with golden eagles and prairie falcons soaring overhead.

DESCHUTES RIVER TRAIL

Easy | 3-mile loop | SW Reed Market Rd., Bend
From Farewell Bend Park, hike upstream into a canyon with soaring pines and steep lava tuff walls. A scenic footbridge midway completes the loop.

GREEN LAKES TRAIL

Easy to Moderate | 9 miles, round trip
Cascade Lakes Hwy.

A classic route for any aspiring long-distance hiker, this is also the primary route taken by those summiting South Sister.

A LITTLE FARTHER...

The Cascade Lakes Highway is a sixty-six-mile-long National Scenic Byway that winds through a volcanic landscape to the stuff of which glossy calendars are made. Take your pick of trails through wildflower-filled meadows and skirt some of the fourteen lakes that reflect the towering peaks of Mt. Bachelor, Broken Top and South Sister.

Hiking Resources

ON YOUR WAY out of Bend, a stop at the new Deschutes National Forest Service Interpretive Center is worthwhile for solid information on hiking adventures.

THE DESCHUTES LAND TRUST hosts free hikes throughout Central Oregon's preserved lands with focuses on birding, geology, wildflowers, butterflies, photography, the cultural history of Bend's logging past and more. Book these small group walks in advance at deschuteslandtrust.org

The days may be short and the air may be cold, but that only fuels Central Oregon's adventurous spirit.

EVEN IN THE COLD AND SNOW, you won't find Central Oregon hibernating. Winter offers a whole new world to explore, from skiing and snowmobiling to snowshoeing and ice-skating. You can begin with fresh tracks on the mountain at Mt. Bachelor or Hoodoo Ski Area and end with fireside après ski at any number of breweries and restaurants in town. Fill your day with other local adventures in this winter wonderland, from visiting exhibits at the High Desert Museum to discovering a new band at a local bar or venue. In the winter, bluebird days aren't a rarity in Central Oregon and you'll find plenty of reasons to get outside.



Sun and snow abound during Central Oregon winters, with legendary powder and accessible expanses of world-class terrain. Our winter playground is vast. Discover the many ways to play in the Cascades.

SNOWMOBILING

Thanks to the efforts of regional snowmobiling clubs, there are hundreds of miles of groomed and well-marked trails to “sled” throughout Central Oregon. If you don’t yet have a sled of your own, rent one through Central Oregon Adventures. Take off from Wanoga Sno-Park near Bend, Edison Butte on the road between Mt. Bachelor and Sunriver, Newberry National Volcanic Monument in La Pine or Hoodoo Ski Area outside of Sisters. Locals love the trip from Dutchman Flat (along Century Drive) out to Elk Lake Resort.

SLEDDING

The place to be for family sledding fun is Wanoga Sno-Park, located off Century Drive on the route to Mt. Bachelor. There’s ample parking and plenty of room to sled, toboggan or inner tube. Bring your hot chocolate or buy it from the snack trailer in the parking lot. Head a little farther up to Mt. Bachelor’s Snowblast Tubing Park and snag a daypass for an afternoon of zooming down the mountain on inner tubes. In Sunriver, SHARC has its own snow-tubing hill, and Hoodoo’s Autobahn Tubing Park is one of the largest snow-tubing parks in the West.

ICE SKATING

In addition to the rinks at The Village at Sunriver and Seventh Mountain Resort near Bend, the new Bend Parks and Recreation rink, The Pavilion, is now open. All three offer outdoor winter skating experiences for your whole family. Drinks are rink-side for your après skate at the two resort rinks, while The Pavillion is an NHL-sized recreation hub. Alternatively, visit the 4,000-square-foot ice skating rink in downtown Redmond.

BACKCOUNTRY SKIING

Superb and among the most accessible in the country, backcountry skiing opportunities await just minutes north and northwest of the Mt. Bachelor ski area. A slightly longer haul is required to get into some virginal backcountry runs in the Newberry National Volcanic Monument, the Three Sisters volcanic peaks and Pine Mountain (east of Bend). For a guided experience, book with Oregon Ski Guides.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Like your trails groomed for skating and classic cross-country skiing? Head to the Mt. Bachelor Nordic Center, Hoodoo Ski Area or the Virginia Meissner Sno-Park. If, however, you prefer ungroomed skiing on marked trails, then try one of the region’s fourteen sno-parks or blaze your own path in the Deschutes National Forest.

SNOWSHOEING

Try marked snowshoe routes at Virginia Meissner and Swampy Lakes sno-parks, off Century Drive just outside of Bend. These are two main areas where snowshoers can find trails, warming huts and solace in the Deschutes National Forest. Join a U.S. Forest Service naturalist at Mt. Bachelor on a free tour to learn about winter ecology and the area's wildlife and plants.

MORE AT MT. BACHELOR

In addition to downhill sports, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing, Mt. Bachelor offers

regularly scheduled dogsled tours led by qualified guides. Oregon Trail of Dreams, owned by an Iditarod-competing family, takes guests into parts of the forest many people never see. *mtbachelor.com*

FAT TIRE BIKING

Snow on the trails doesn't mean the end of our cycling season. Enjoy the winter wonderland on two wheels via fat tire bike—a mountain bike with extra wide tires. Cog Wild offers fat bike tours led by experienced riders. The three-hour tours are open to all experience levels. *cogwild.com*

How I show off the region to visitors: We are lucky to call Bend our home and, of course, Mt. Bachelor is in our backyard so all our friends and family enjoy coming to Bend to ski. Tumalo Falls is a great place for snowshoeing. After a cold day playing in the snow, we stop in at some breweries along the Bend Ale Trail.

Where to refuel: The first stop on the way down from the mountain is Cascade Lakes Lodge. All the breweries have great eats and we try to rotate through all our favorites. If I had to pick a favorite beer, it would be Deschutes Red Chair, though you really can't get a bad craft beer in Bend.

Powder Perfection

On Top of the World: Mt. Bachelor.

Mt. Bachelor's reputation for deep powder, a long season and incredible vistas is well deserved. The mountain received a hefty 604 inches of snowfall during the 2016-2017 season, putting it among the top fifteen resorts in the country for snowfall. The 360-degree, lift-served mountain provides views for miles north over the Three Sisters Wilderness, west over the High Cascade Lakes, south toward Crater Lake and east over the High Desert.

During the cross-country ski boom in the 1970s, the folks at Mt. Bachelor were early adopters, adding a groomed trail system. One of America's first ski areas to welcome snowboarders, embrace telemark skiing and install high-speed lifts, the people at Mt. Bachelor have always been forward thinking.

This year, the 4,318-acre resort is at it again, becoming the 6th-largest ski area in the United States as the result of a 635-acre expansion. The newest lift, Cloudchaser, is a high-speed quad on the east side of the mountain, spanning 1,448 vertical feet and runs that were widened in the offseason. Be among the first to access this new powdery terrain.

The mountain is a playground. From big air and tricks at the terrain parks to the lift-served Snowblast Tubing Park, get your adrenaline pumping. The Mt. Bachelor Nordic Center has fifty-six kilometers of groomed trails for both skate skiing and classic skiing. From the center's vintage log cabin, sign up for lessons, get rentals, warm by a wood-burning stove, and cozy up for a snack (these may be the region's best burritos) and hot chocolate.

Night Skiing Hoodoo You Love?

Central Oregon's only night-skiing destination, the Hoodoo Ski Area just west of Sisters lets you ski under the stars (and the lights) on Fridays and Saturdays. Hoodoo offers uncrowded, affordable, family-friendly charm on five lifts, including three high-speed quad lifts and 806 skiable and rideable acres. With nearly all the runs ending at the main ski bowl near the lodge, it's easy for families and friends to stay together.

Another way to enjoy this terrain is on the nineteen kilometers of groomed cross-country ski trails. Even non-skiers can tap into gravity-fueled excitement with downhill snowbikes, essentially bikes on skis. At the Autobahn Tubing Park, one of

the largest cable tows in the country takes riders to the top of the hill for more than 800 feet of inner-tubing downhill fun.

Hoodoo also offers the most ski-in, ski-out RV hookups in Oregon. With thirty-two RV spaces just a few steps from the lodge, it's easy to order a Hoodoo Voodoo IPA and tailgate right from your RV or trailer. Bring plenty of firewood and a fire pit to cozy up around the flames at night while the snow falls, covering up the day's tracks so you can start anew tomorrow.

HOT TIP: Nearby Black Butte Ranch offers packages starting at \$195 that include two lift tickets or four tubing passes, movie tickets and a \$25 dining voucher.

Get your cone fix at Bontà Natural Artisan Gelato. The most coveted sweet in Bend is the ocean roll at Sparrow Bakery. Ida's Cupcake Cafe makes gourmet frosting and cakes

that are frosted to order, so you can mix and match. Head to Goody's for a sweet taste of Americana.


CART CULTURE

The food cart culture that has become a culinary phenomenon across the country has firmly taken root here, with food carts in every Central Oregon town.

CULINARY IMMERSION

At Cascade Culinary Institute, students share their talents at the institute's restaurant, Elevation, where three-course lunches and dinners highlight seasonal ingredients at an affordable price. Get creative at Immersion Brewing, where you can team up with your


closest friends and Immersion's experts to brew your own beer. More than thirty recipes are available during the two-hour brew-it-yourself experience. Immersion provides instruction, ingredients and storage during fermentation. At the bottling session, your five gallons of beer will be chilled, carbonated, and ready to label and bottle. For an educational but less involved option, Worthy Brewing offers brewmaster tours that include a visit to their onsite hop farm. Also check out Worthy's newest venture, Taps and Tacos in downtown Bend (opening spring 2018).

Tapping into Central Oregon Libations

The region's craft breweries, cideries and artisan distilleries pour plenty of toast-worthy drinks.

With more than two dozen craft breweries, Central Oregon is officially a beer lover's destination. Bend is a leader in craft beer because of the number of breweries per capita and the innovation that keeps pushing the industry forward. This trend also inspired a vanguard of craft distillers creating small-batch bourbon, gin and more spirits, plus cideries fermenting Northwest fruit. With all these options, the only real question is where to start and when to stop. Here's a guide to the musts.

CRAFT BEER

The area's breweries exemplify Northwest-style food and beer. Pubs are great options for families and large groups. Go to Bend Brewing Company, which recently expanded its outdoor space to extend down to Mirror

Pond. Visit the original pub of the famed Deschutes Brewery or go on a free tour of the brewing facility. More eat and drink options include Crux Fermentation Project, Immersion Brewing, 10 Barrel Brewing Company, Cascade Lakes Brewing Co. Lodge, Silver Moon Brewing and Worthy Brewing (all in Bend). Find a huge selection of beers on tap and an entire case of bottled beers from Oregon and around the world at Bend's Broken Top Bottle Shop, also a favorite for vegetarian fare. Redmond has Wild Ride Brewing and Cascade Lakes Brewing's 7th Street Brew House. In Sisters, head to Three Creeks Brewing. Sunriver Brewery, with pubs in Bend and Sunriver, earned the titles of National Small Brewery of the Year and National Brewer of the Year at the 2017 Great American Beer Festival.

WINE, CIDER & SPIRITS

North of Redmond, Maragas Winery makes an award-winning Muskat and offers tastings, tours and events to the tune of live music. Views of Smith Rock and the Cascades can be seen from both Maragas Winery's and Faith, Hope and Charity Vineyards' tasting rooms. At the base of Smith Rock's towering walls, Ranch at the Canyons' vineyard is set in a rural Tuscan-style estate with breathtaking views of the Cascades, desert canyons and rolling farmlands. Sisters-based Cascade Street Distillery has frame-worthy label art and sip-worthy spirits. In Tumalo, visit Bend Distillery's tasting room, adjacent to the farm where some of its ingredients are grown. Oregon Spirit Distillers in Bend crafts a bourbon to rival any Kentucky sour mash. Atlas Cider Co. ferments fresh fruit from Northwest farmers to achieve balanced sweet, tart and dry ciders.



WATERING HOLES

Nearly all Central Oregon pubs and bars serve local brews, which is noteworthy in a mostly rural region. Favorites include Craft Kitchen & Brewery in Bend and Twisted River Tavern or Village Bar & Grill in Sunriver.

CELEBRATE THE NECTAR

Central Oregon’s beer festival season starts with Central Oregon Beer Week in May and wraps up with the Sisters Fresh Hop Fest and The Little Woody Barrel Aged Brew Festival in September. The mid-summer Bend Brewfest is a raucous, weekend-long tasting event in the Old Mill District that showcases nearly 200 beers from eighty-six breweries and cideries from around the country.

RIDE ON

Bend’s Cycle Pub is essentially a pedal-powered bar on wheels. Beer drinkers provide the pedal power, while an expert provides steering and brakes en route to pubs. Bend Tour Company’s Bend Brew Taps Tour offers fun, door-to-door tours of the whole scene with knowledgeable designated drivers.

FIRE PITS

We aren’t sure why beer tastes better next to flames, but people tend to gravitate toward the fire pits at 10 Barrel, Crux, O’Kanes at McMenamins Old St. Francis School, Greg’s Grill, Anthony’s and Sunriver Brewing’s Bend location.





GALLERIES AND MUSEUMS

Artists from around North America display their work in the Old Mill District by the Deschutes River during a three-day outdoor festival, Art in the High Desert. Sunriver Art Fair was named "Best Small Town Art Fair" by Art Fair Calendar in 2016 and proceeds support local nonprofits.

Art Walks

Once a month, local galleries and businesses stay open late

to celebrate the regional talent of artists and artisans. Sip local libations while you peruse the latest works within each neighborhood. Join the art walkers in downtown Bend on the first Friday, downtown Sisters on the fourth Friday and the Old Ironworks district in Bend on the last Saturday of each month.

Driving Tour

Art takes to the streets in the High Desert, with sculptures from local artists displayed in twenty local roundabouts. Bend Tour Company will do the driving for you, so you can focus on art instead of traffic.



Local Knowledge

Owner, *Cowgirl Cash*

Home neighborhood: Larkspur (Near Pilot Butte)

About my business: I opened my business eight years ago in its current location. My first shop was in a crafters mall where various artists and retailers rented space under one roof. There, I discovered that I could fill a need for vintage Western wear, from authentic cowboy boots to turquoise jewelry, belt buckles and hats. People are attracted to items that have a feel of old Bend. I added locally made dresses because boots and timeless cotton dresses are just too cute together.

Where to explore: I love the Deschutes River Trail. As Bend gets bigger and busier I tend to drive ten minutes farther to ensure that I have it almost to myself. East Benham Falls, past Lava Butte, is my current favorite spot for putting in my SUP, going for a trail run or heading out on a mountain bike ride.

How I show off the region to visitors: I usually start with a hike up Pilot Butte. It's such a great place to get a lay of the land. From the top, face west and the Cascade Mountain Range is showcased perfectly, face east and the High Desert landscape holds many opportunities for adventure. I often take friends up Tumalo Mountain (out Cascade Lakes Highway, four-mile hike out and back), as well. Early mornings are best.

Ideal day-off activity: Wandering around downtown is always a treat. We have many unique shops. Don't miss our alleys, as they are filled with art and history. I love the Deschutes Historical Society, located in the old Reed School. I attended first grade in that building, so it's extra special. At Cowgirl Cash, you can buy a set of illustrated playing cards with renderings of iconic Bend spots, including many of our roundabouts. Cowgirl Cash is on the eight-of-clubs.

A little farther...

You don't have to go to the remote reaches of the globe to find clear views of the night sky. The Oregon Observatory at Sunriver and the Pine Mountain Observatory east of Bend are perfect locations to watch for shooting stars. Back in town, Worthy Brewing's Hopservatory has a live NASA feed, a telescope and pints.

TUNES

Local restaurants and bars, including Broken Top Bottle Shop and McMenamins Old St. Francis School in Bend, showcase regional musicians. Find more bands and musicians on tour at venues such as Oregon Spirit

Distillers in Sisters or the Tower Theatre in Bend. Jazz fans will be pleasantly surprised to hear about the Riverhouse Mt. Bachelor Jazz Series, in addition to Jazz at the Oxford.

Summer

Summer nights are filled with national music acts—such as Dave Matthews Band, Steve Miller Band and Alabama Shakes—playing to the crowd at the Les Schwab Amphitheater along the Deschutes River. Two other outdoor venue gems in Bend include The Athletic Club of Bend and the Century Center. Regional musicians play free concerts throughout the summer for the community at Munch & Music ▶

in downtown's Drake Park. Classical music fans will enjoy the Sunriver Music Festival at Sunriver Resort, an annual festival in August.

Spring

Bend's NorthWest Crossing brings free outdoor concerts to the neighborhood park, along with food and drinks from local restaurants and breweries.

Fall

Sisters is a hub of the Central Oregon music scene with September's Sisters Folk Festival. The three-day event draws the best of American

folk music—from both local and national acts—to the small town. Participation is widespread, with performances held at local shops and venues.

FILM

Venues and organizations such as Tin Pan Theater, McMenamins Old St. Francis School, Tower Theatre and BendFilm showcase independent films and second-run films throughout the year. A multiscreen Regal Cinemas complex in Bend's Old Mill, Redmond Cinema, Pine Theater in Prineville and the Sisters Movie House play first-run films.

CONFERENCE

Held in March each year, the Muse Conference is a five-day event that celebrates and empowers women and girls. The conference brings in world-renowned speakers to inspire social change.

THEATER

Local playhouses and theater companies Cascades Theatre, 2nd Street Theater and Tower Theatre stage productions year-round, showcasing the region's talent. The Tower Theatre regularly hosts national acts, including comedians, authors, and theater and dance troupes.

More than 9,400 seats were filled during BendFilm in 2017. People traveled from around the country to celebrate independent film.

TENTH MONTH

In October, independent events Bend Design Conference, BendFilm Festival, Bend Venture Conference and Swivel Digital + Creative Marketing Conference join forces as the suite of Tenth Month events. Bend Design Conference and BendFilm draw nationally-recognized artists, filmmakers and aspiring creatives for collaboration and conversation. The Bend Venture Conference shines the spotlight on local entrepreneurs and businesses that are shaping the community. Swivel Digital + Creative Marketing Conference brings thought leaders in the new era of marketing. Throughout the month, Bend will be filled with entrepreneurs, designers and filmmakers who are crafting and celebrating the best in business, technology and art. Tenth Month celebrates the ideas coming to and from Central Oregon that will shape the future of the region and beyond.

Business Relocation Profiles

Facebook opened its first data center in Prineville in 2011 with tremendous support from many state and local leaders. Central Oregon's high desert climate and low humidity allowed for energy-efficient server designs that resulted in 38 percent less energy usage than industry standards, while also saving 24 percent in construction and operation costs. Prineville is now home to one of the largest data center campuses in the country, with the recent addition of **Apple's** third center.

A seventeen-year friendship led to the successful relocation of BasX Solutions from Tigard, Oregon, to Redmond. In 1997, Eric Sande (EDCO's then Redmond partner) proposed a site to Huntair founder Dave Benson to accommodate the company's expansion. While timing was off for that opportunity, he later founded BasX, a manufacturer of custom engineered products for the building and construction industry. When the right facility opened up in 2014, Dave moved BasX to

Redmond, exemplifying EDCO's economic development efforts through lasting, personal relationships.

Matt Gilman, founder of **Chivaz Wear** (chee-vaz), recently left the rat race of Sunnyvale, California, for the "views-n-brews" community of Redmond, where he is now building his sock company. "We love that Redmond has a lot of small-town charm, plenty of space to grow, nice people that look you in the eye and a super supportive business community that wants to see you succeed."

Matt Foster relocated his company, **Maverick Leather**, to Bend in 2015 after the family came to visit Matt's son who had been attending flight school here. They had an instant connection with the area. Realizing there were no companies in Central Oregon doing what they do, they moved the business, the family and all their employees. Matt's advice for others relocating to the area? "Call EDCO! We couldn't have done it without them."

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
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
